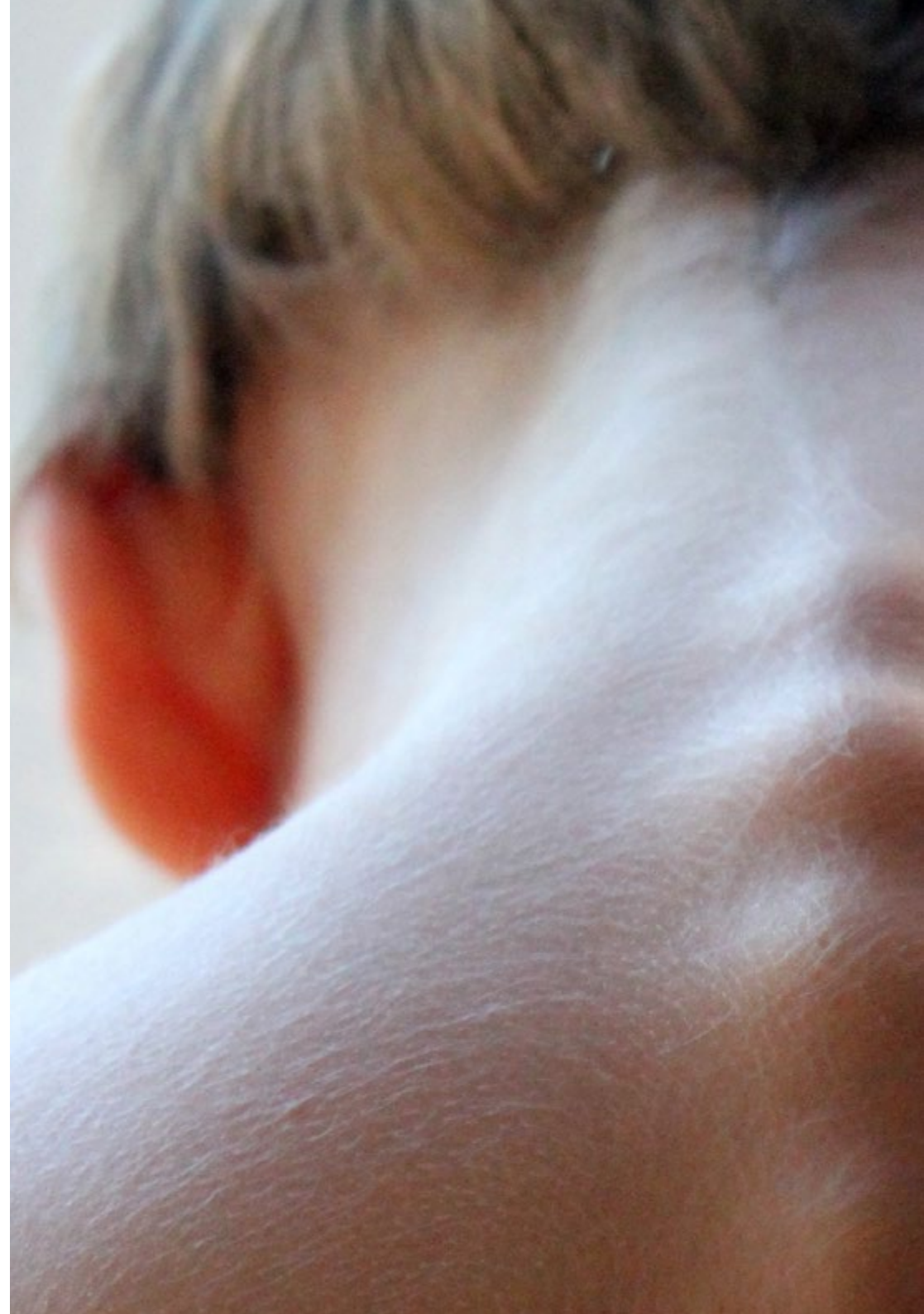

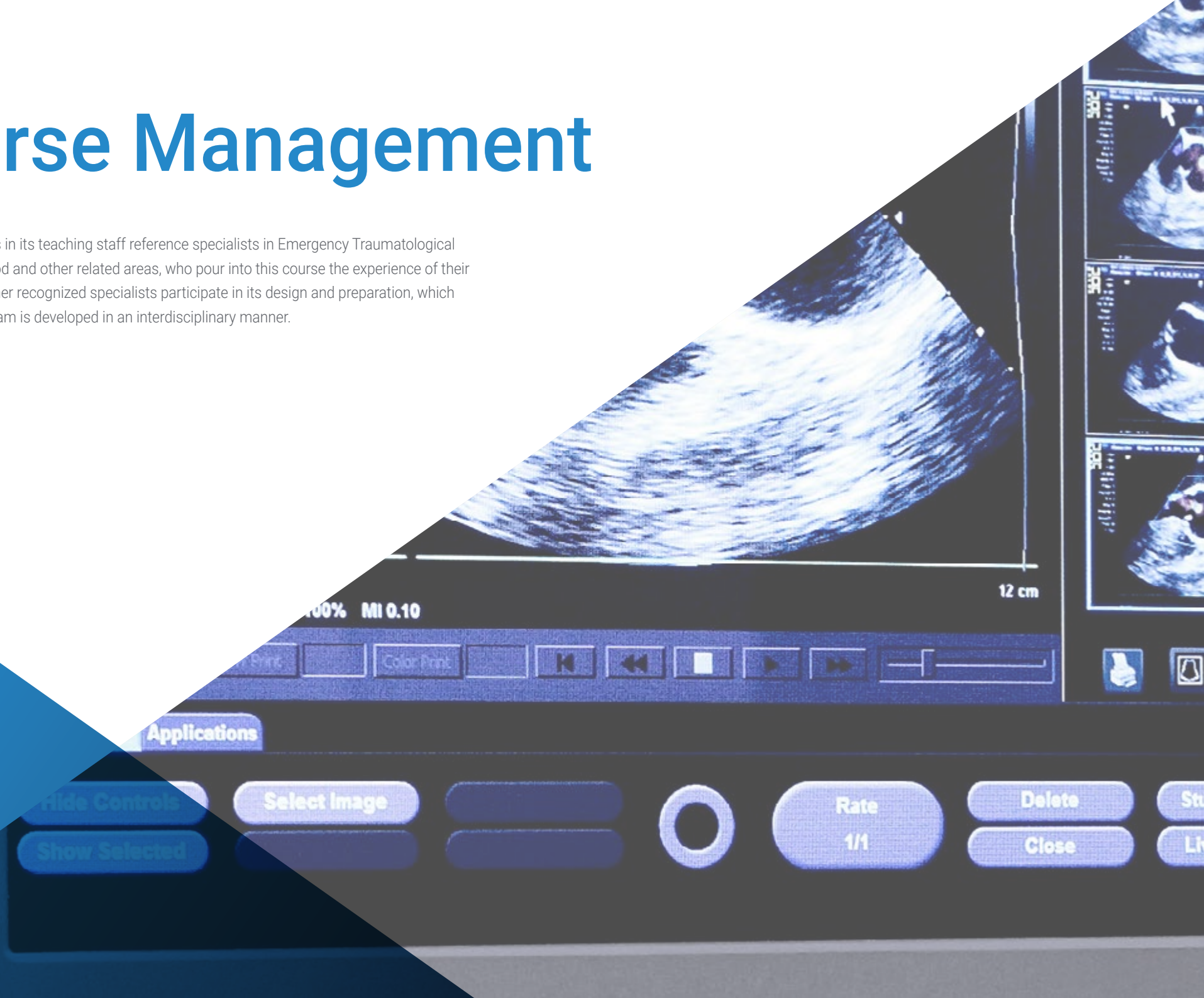

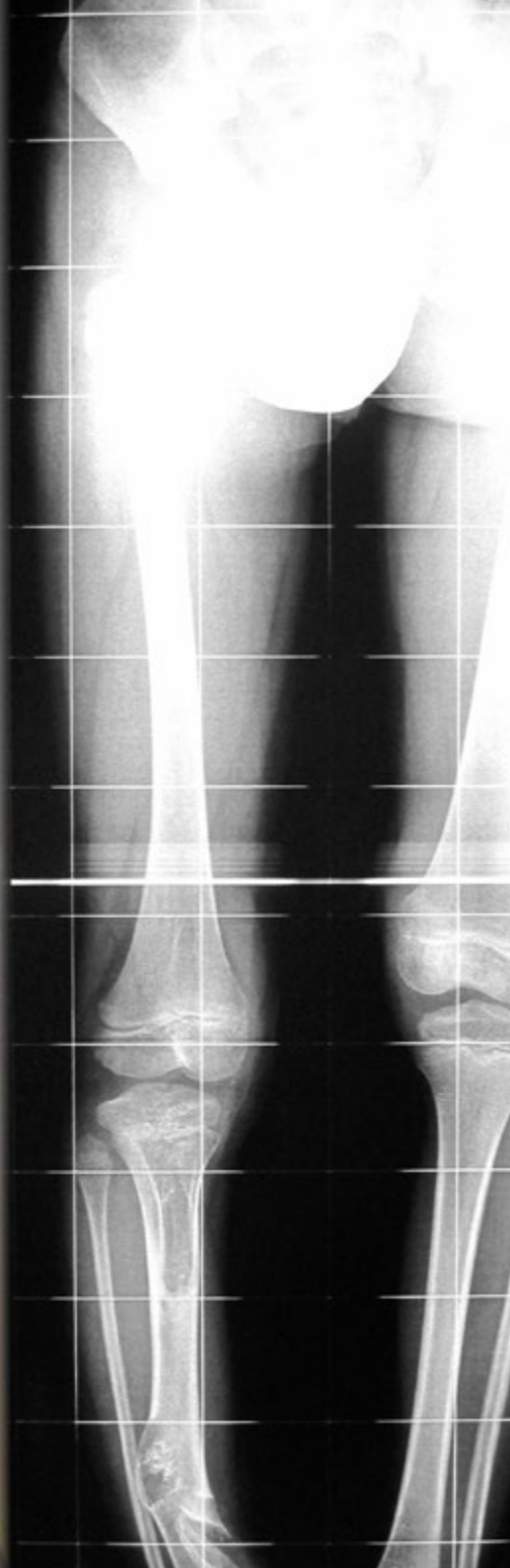

05 Methodology
