



In 1924, Harvard adopted it as a standard teaching method"

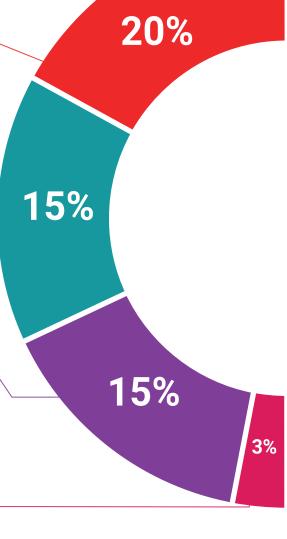

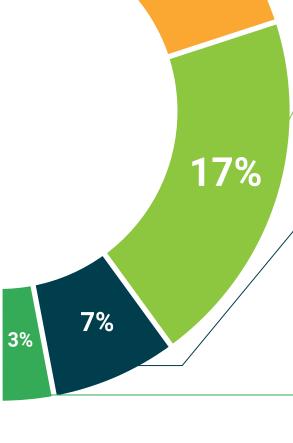
